Quadrant Road Names

Chestnut Homes have announced that the road names for the first phase of this development are:

Wallace Way – The main Quadrant Road, named after Captain Wallace who sailed the Steam trawler 'Wyberton' the 11,000 miles to Shanghai in 1922 in 68 days when it was sold to the Chinese.

Mercer Lane - Mercer was one of the crew on Captain Wallace's trawler

Scott Drive – George Gilbert Scott Junior was the architect that restored St Leodegar's, Wyberton's Parish Church in 1882.

Field Drive – William Field founded a charity that is now part of Wyberton United Charities that supports widows of the Parish. It owns the two bungalows at the entrance to the 'Orchards'.

Wells Place - Wells Slade was the name of a medieval moated Manor House. The site is now a grass field on Church Lane with humps and hollows and was renamed Wybert's Castle in the Victorian period.

Webster Walk – William Webster born in Wyberton in 1819. He became a builder in the village and later was associated with a number of Thames embankment projects.

Part Night Street Lighting

Frampton Marsh RSPB

It's a great time to visit the reserve with thousands of birds now crowding in, making a real spectacle. Ducks, geese, swans, waders have arrived from further north, escaping the colder weather. It is impressive to see 4,000 widgeon swimming in front of the visitor centre while 10,000 golden plover wheel overhead. All these bring in the predators; peregrines from town love hunting here and are they joined by hen harriers and merlin down from upland areas elsewhere in the UK.

Boston Woods Trust

A senior director of the Forestry Commission made a recent visit. He commented that he knew of no better woodland amenity in the UK! Greatly increased visitor numbers are showing how much it is appreciated; it's a great feeling for everyone in the area now the dreams of 20 years ago are now a reality. There are seven kilometres of all-weather paths 90,000 trees and acres of meadowland to enjoy... and it's all been created by volunteers.
